Objectives

Following on the success of the first two workshops held at the University of Oslo and McMaster University, we are pleased to host the 3rd Workshop on Behavioral and Experimental Health Economics.

The workshop aims to bring together economists who apply behavioral economics and experimental methods in health economic research to present and discuss their research papers. We welcome contributions on all topics within health economics applying experimental methods, be it laboratory or field studies, and behavioral economics modeling.

We plan for a small workshop in which each paper is allocated one hour (45 minutes paper presentation, 15 minutes general discussion) to enable participants to present their work in detail.

Special CEAR Session on Risk

Besides presentations of papers on all topics in experimental health economics, there is a special session organized by Professor Glenn Harrison which is devoted to the role of risk in health economics.

Submission

If you are interested in presenting a paper, please submit either the full paper (if available), or an extended abstract of up to 1000 words that addresses each of the following: objectives, methods, results, and conclusions. Please send submissions to:

The deadline for abstract submission is September 1st, 2015. Authors will be notified regarding the acceptance of their paper by October 1st, 2015.
