

Call for Papers International Health Economics Workshop June 24—25, 2022, Tilburg, The Netherlands

The Committee for International Cooperation of the German Society for Health Economics (DGGÖ) organizes a workshop which will take place in **Tilburg** on **June 24-25**, **2022**. The workshop is organized by Tilburg University and the University of Mainz. The workshop aims to bring together members of the DGGÖ and other researchers at any level of seniority working in empirical health economics or related topics.

We invite paper submissions on topics in empirical health economics and econometrics, such as,

- Econometric methods with applications in health
- The development of physical and mental health in childhood and adolescence
- The effects of physical and mental health on education and labor market outcomes
- Health at older ages and retirement

11 papers will be selected for a presentation of 30 minutes and will be followed by a discussion of 10 minutes and 5 minutes for questions. Presenters at the workshop may be asked to also act as discussants.

There is no participation fee for the workshop. Lunches and a Dinner on Friday will be covered. The workshop starts on Friday morning and ends on Saturday afternoon.
