We are inviting abstracts for the 2024 fall meeting of the Working Group Entwicklungszusammenarbeit (Health Economics and Development Cooperation) of the Deutsche Gesellschaft für Gesundheitsökonomie (German Society of Health Economics) on all themes relevant to Health Economics and Development.

This year we will privilege abstracts related to the thematic focus: ***“Health Economics, Development and Climate Change: Challenges and perspectives in low and middle income countries (LMICs)”***. Under this theme, we welcome abstracts that concern a wide variety of topics such as:

- health systems and policy reactions to climate change, design of (cost-)effective adaptation strategies (e.g. adapting elements of health systems)
- exploring how to achieve carbon emission reductions in healthcare (e.g. implementing clean technology solutions) and determining their costs
- examining how climate-change induced challenges related to NCDs, IDs and NTDs can be addressed
- studying financing designs to exploit synergies between health and climate change adaptation
- addressing challenges related to the expansion of social and environmental health protection programs

We welcome both scientific abstracts (describing conceptual frameworks, formative research and impact or process evaluation analyses) and practice-oriented abstracts describing experiences by implementers and their development partners.

We are unable to cover travel costs through the organization of the event, hence attendees have to seek own travel funding.
