



4th Workshop in Behavioral and Experimental Health Economics Cologne, December 8-9, 2016

Following the success of the previous workshops in Oslo, Hamilton, and Essen, we are pleased to host the fourth *Workshop in Behavioral and Experimental Health Economics* in Cologne. The workshop brings together economists who apply behavioral insights and experimental methods to health economics in order to present and discuss their research. The workshop is part of the activities of the *Behavioural Experiments in Health Network*: www.beh-net.org.

We welcome contributions on all topics within health economics applying experimental methods, be it laboratory or field experiments. Topics of this year's workshop focus on provider incentives, patient behavior, and risk preferences in health (Special *CEAR* Session on Risk organized by Glenn Harrison). Each paper is allocated one hour (40 min. presentation, 10 min. comments by a discussant, 10 min. general discussion) to provide participants with the opportunity for an in-depth discussion.

Submission

If you are interested in presenting a paper, please submit either the full paper, or an extended abstract of up to 1,000 words that addresses each of the following: objectives, methods, results, and conclusions. Please send submissions to: beh-workshop@wiso.uni-koeln.de

Deadline for abstract submission is **September 4th, 2016**. Authors will be notified regarding the acceptance of their paper by October 7th, 2016. The workshop is taking place in Cologne on December 8th and 9th, 2016.

Authors of the papers accepted for presentation at the workshop are encouraged to contribute to a special issue on *Behavioral Experiments in Health* in the journal *Health Economics*.
