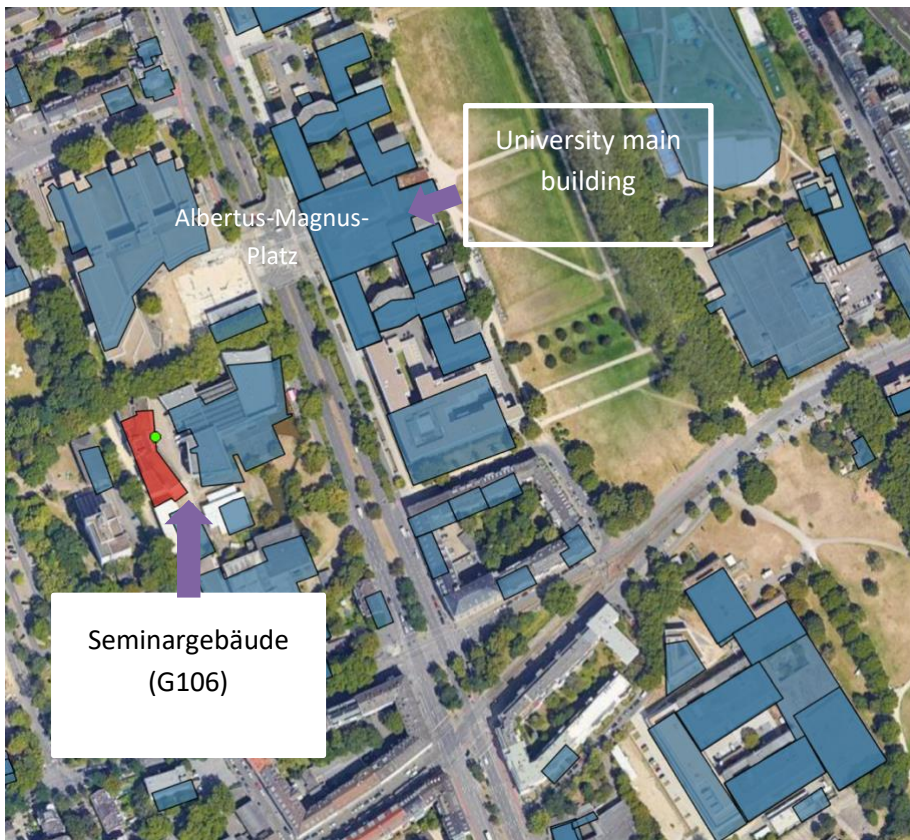
- The workshop language is English.

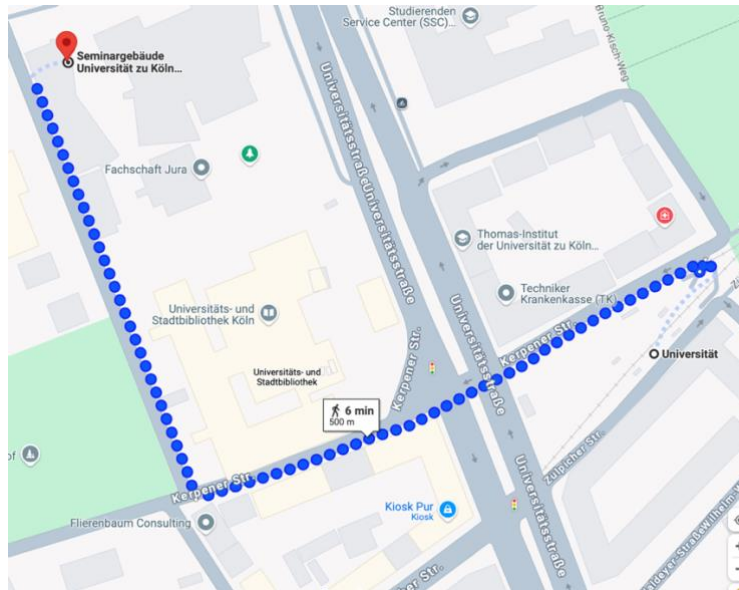
Location and directions

Workshop venue: *Tagungsraum* (ground floor), *Seminargebäude* (Building 106)
Universitätsstraße 37, 50931 Cologne close to Albertus-Magnus-Platz.



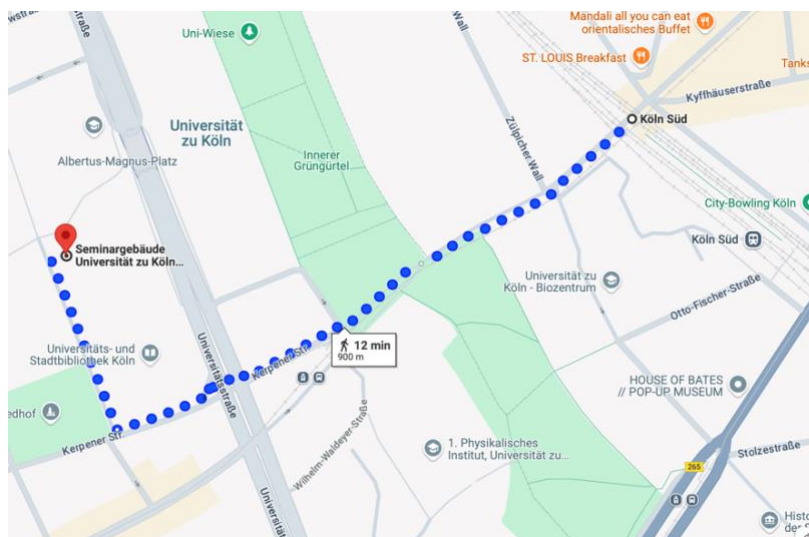
How to get to the venue?

From Cologne Central Station: Take U-Bahn Line 14 (direction “Keupstr.”), 16 (direction “Bonn Hbf”), or 18 (direction “Schwadorf”) for two stops to “Neumarkt.” There, transfer to Tram Line 9 (direction “Sülz”) and travel four or five stops to “Universität” or “Köln Weyertal.” From either stop, it’s just a short walk to the ***Seminargebäude***; see Map 1. Ticket machines are available on the platform and in the trains, or you can purchase tickets conveniently via the KVB app. Overall, the journey takes about 20 minutes.



Map 1: Walking route from the “Universität” stop to the seminar building of the University of Cologne

From Cologne South Station (walking): Exit the station in direction of “Zülpicher Straße” and turn left. Follow Zülpicher Straße towards Lindenthal. After about 250 meters, Zülpicher Straße becomes Kerpener Straße. Continue on this road for another 400 meters to the intersection with Universitätsstraße. Turn right and walk about 200 meters further. The **Seminargebäude** of the University of Cologne (Building 106) is on your right at Universitätsstraße 37 (walking time: about 10 min.); see Map 2.

From Cologne Messe/Deutz Station: Take Tram Line 9 (direction “Sülz”) and travel seven or eight stops to “Universität” or “Köln Weyertal.” A taxi ride from Messe/Deutz Station to the university costs about 25 Euros
